I'm a backyard birdwatcher. I enjoy studying the birds that come to our feeder. Kathie and I never attracted too many blue jays until we moved to Chambersburg. They take up residence in the tall trees of our neighborhood all year long.

Although their electric-blue is beautiful, most birdwatchers don't welcome blue jays because they are big, loud, aggressive and scare away other songbirds. But I learned a few things about them. Did you know, for example, they are related to the American crow? Did you know they mate for life and stay with their young up to two months after they fledge? And did you know that "jay birds" have expandable throats and esophagus?

They love to feed on acorns and beechnuts. One blue jay will tuck as many as three nuts in its throat, one in its mouth and one in its bill, fly as far as a mile and cache or store them for later in open fields which mark its territory. A jay will cache as many as 3,000 nuts in a season. And while blue jays have excellent memories for where they hide their harvest, some of it is overlooked or never used. Because of this, blue jays are capable of reforesting land that has been cleared and left fallow. That pin oak or beech tree you see might just be the remnant of a seed your friendly neighborhood jay once planted.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, you and I go through life and cache seeds for him. Our smiles plant the seed of love, our self-control the seed of peace. When we affirm the gifts of another we leave behind seeds of confidence and value. Seeds of faith are planted by our testimony. Our persistence caches the seed of hope.

Like the blue jay, we may unintentionally cache seeds that we will leave behind and never be aware of what grew in their place. But a harvest will grow and mature for the Lord because of what you and I are storing up in life for him.


