I had a trip down Memory Lane last week. Immediately following the P.E.R.K. service, one of our younger worshipers came to me and gave me a paper hand-puppet which she had lovingly made (see picture). I had not thought about nor seen one of these for many, many years. We used to make them when I was in school.

The puppet is actually just a head. When I cradle it between my thumb and one of my fingers and apply some pressure, I can make my puppet's mouth go up and down.

Disguising my own voice, I can make my puppet "talk" and say anything I want it to say. That's because it's a puppet – a paper toy that is just an extension of myself.

When God created us, God put into us his own breath, his spirit. God tuned us to the frequency of his own heart so that, when we draw near to him, we resonate with his presence (May 20th sermon). God gave us our unique personality with a will to say and do what we choose for ourselves. Then God relaxed his hand and turned us loose to be and to experience everything for which he created us.

My paper puppet can only mechanically and thoughtlessly move at my bidding. It can only ever experience what I choose to share with it. I think to myself, God could have created you and me to be like puppets, but he gave us our independence in *hope* that we will choose his will anyway. Sometimes I wonder how that has worked out for God, but he wouldn't have it any other way.

Also, 29 Southern PA District congregations and one individual donated \$39,934.04 toward funding for the 2018 project. Chambersburg Church of the Brethren sent volunteers two days and gave a total donation of \$3,019.00 toward the 2018 meat canning project. Four skids of canned chicken were sent to Honduras and Cuba and the two Districts each received over 390 cases to distribute to various agencies, food banks and congregations, to help local persons in need.




Taste of the Valley was held on April 10, 2018 with \$6,399.72 raised. Thanks to those who enjoyed the evening.


