The 2021 Congregational Council Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 21 at 11 am in the Sanctuary following the combined worship service at 10 am. Please bring a pen or pencil to mark your ballots as they will not be distributed at the meeting. Packets for the meeting will be distributed in church boxes by November 7th.

Given the unusual circumstances associated with COVID, church members who do not feel comfortable attending the meeting in person will be given the opportunity to vote for new Board members, confirm annual conference and district conference delegates and vote on the 2022 budget by absentee ballot. On Thursday, November 18, Carol Wingert and a Board member will be at the church from 5-7 pm to distribute and collect ballots. To vote, you will drive into the parking lot behind the church and remain in your car. You will be handed two ballots per member. After marking the ballots, you will place them into separate, closed boxes, which will not be opened until Sunday morning when the other ballots are counted.

Please note that allowing voting by absentee ballot again this year does not establish a precedent for absentee ballots at future council meetings. We are simply responding to limitations presented in relation to COVID concerns and in the spirit of including members who cannot risk exposure.

# Stewardship Snapshot

The next several weeks will have an emphasis on Stewardship. The Church Board asked the Stewardship Commission to provide an update on our general giving compared to the expenses. We will be providing detailed figures through several methods of communication.

Stewardship first would like to highlight that 2018 was the last year the Church's revenues exceeded the expenses. Our Business Manager will be providing a one-page report that summarizes the financial picture of our Church over the past few years. The trend shows that revenue will need to increase and the expenses need to be reduced in order to be sustainable.

The Stewardship Commission has met with the Board twice over the past few months and is recommending that the congregation receive these highlights and be made aware. The Stewardship Commission has recommended the Board consider reducing each Commission budget for 2022 by up to ten percent. Again, more communication and a financial highlight page will be provided soon.


