


The Pastor's Pen...

Kathie and I recently spent six days in Israel, visiting the places that were near and dear to our Lord. It is very difficult to describe with accuracy what we experienced there, yet with all my heart I wish for you to have the opportunity to make the pilgrimage too.

Our first day was spent along the Sea of Galilee. While no small pond by any means, the lake was not as vast as I pictured it in my mind. To be on Galilee is to feel at peace. There on the mount where Jesus gave the beatitudes in Matthew 5 there was a quiet, thoughtful reverence as pilgrims re-read the passage with the lake in the background.

One of my highlights on the trip was the visit to the Galilee baptismal site on the Jordan River. Like my predecessor, Alexander Mack, I was baptized by a good friend whereupon I, in turn, baptized the others – seventeen in all. I could picture Jesus as he was baptized by his cousin, John.

Other highlights included being at the site where Jesus reinstated Peter (Do you love me more than these?); being on the Mount of Olives, overlooking the city of Jerusalem; placing my hand on the rock of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed, “not my will by Thy will be done.”

I loved, loved, loved being in Bethlehem and praying next to the marker that recognizes the official birthplace of Jesus. Quite honestly, the City of Bethlehem was one of the main reasons I wanted to take the tour and I was not disappointed. In my June 26 sermon, I mentioned praying at the wailing wall and then witnessing the parade of families celebrating a bar mitzvah with great joy.

But the ultimate highlight was the privilege of leading our group in bread and cup communion when we visited what possibly was the empty tomb of Jesus. It was a powerful and emotional moment.

The Christians in Israel say the Holy Land is the “Fifth Gospel” because it helps visualize and clarify Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. My only regret is that Kathie and I took the trip in the twilight of my ministry as it would have been so helpful to have taken it twenty years earlier. But then was not God’s time. I am thankful for the time we spent both in ministry and in the Holy Land and I would do it again in a heartbeat.

Eight Twenty Eight by Ian & Larissa Murphy. Two college students are in love and planning their marriage. Then a terrible accident --How do they go on?


Ghost Soldiers by Hampton Sides. The story of how POWs banded together to survive in the Philippines during WWII.


