
Brief Report:

- Paul Mundey led two in-service sessions for pastors and lay persons on Friday, September 15.
 The morning session was titled, "Care-Fronting: How to Fight Fair When We Differ As God's People, and the afternoon session was titled, "The Contagious Congregation: Thriving as a Vital, Outreaching Church!" These two sessions were well attended approximately 60 people.
- Paul Mundey was the guest preacher at Friday night's worship service. His sermon was titled,
 "Eyes That See the Glory" based on Romans 15:1-13. If you were unable to attend the worship
 service, you can find a link on the church Facebook page to view the service. We had several
 people from other churches within the district join the choir for the anthem. It was a nice time
 to sing to the Lord with our fellow COB brothers and sisters.
- Saturday, September 16 began the conference business sessions.
 - After an opening time of praise and hearing God's Word, the business session began with the consecration of delegates. Representing our church were: Rhonda DeShong, Linda Hawbaker, Ian Irvin, Ali Toms, and Liz Thorpe.
 - The ballot was distributed and voted upon for district board members.
 - Two annual meetings which take place each year at district conference: The Brethren Home Board Meeting, and the Children's Aid Society Board Meeting
 - Reports were presented for: COB Denominational, Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center,
 District Board and Commissions, District Executive, Financials for the District, District
 Auditors, Standing Committee, and Camp Eder

- DFMA (District Financial Ministries Allocation) was voted on and approved. The DFMA is the amount the district assesses each church per member. The amount per member for one year is \$87.
- o There were two insight sessions held during the lunch time.
 - The first was on Brethren Disaster Ministries and how they are working in and out of the United States to help those who have been impacted by disasters. They have responded to tornado and hurricane damaged areas bringing items such as the clean-up kits and hygiene kits to those in need. Our church has assembled and sent these kits to Brethren Disaster Ministries many times in previous years.
 - The second session was given by the District Stewardship Commission explaining the District budget in more detail. This was an opportunity for people to ask questions concerning the budget which was later voted on during the afternoon business session.
- Our District Executive, Bill Waugh, retired effective the close of business of District Conference.
 Bill and his wife, Dawn, were presented with flowers and gift cards as a "thank you" for the nine years Bill served as our District Executive. We wish Bill well in his retirement.
- Conference concluded with the recognition of outgoing board members and the consecration of those newly elected to the board. At the close of the session, Moderator Terry Smith passed the gavel to the 2024 Moderator, John Hess.
- Following the conference, the District Board met and affirmed Georgia Markey as the interim District Executive while a search is being conducted for a new DE.

A WORD FROM PASTOR GRETCHEN,

As fall settles in we move into a new season of the year. A time to let what's old fall away so that months from now the new will come. We each can ponder areas of our life where we can work to let go of what no longer serves us. Anger, resentment, disappointment, frustration, and bitterness are just a few negative emotions we'll talk about letting go of in Youth Group this fall. These emotions leave permanent scars.

The Fence story - Author Unknown

There once was a young boy with a very bad temper. The boy's father wanted to teach him a lesson, so he gave him a bag of nails and told him that every time he lost his temper, he must hammer a nail into their wooden fence.

On the first day of this lesson, the little boy had driven 37 nails into the fence. He was really mad!

Over the course of the next few weeks, the little boy began to control his anger, so the number of nails that were hammered into the fence dramatically decreased.

It wasn't long before the little boy discovered it was easier to hold his temper than to drive those nails into the fence.

Then, the day finally came when the little boy didn't lose his temper even once, and he became so proud of himself, he couldn't wait to tell his father.

Pleased, his father suggested that he now pull out one nail for each day that he could hold his temper.

Several weeks went by and the day finally came when the young boy was able to tell his father that all the nails were gone.

Very gently, the father took his son by the hand and led him to the fence.

"You have done very well, my son," he smiled, "but look at the holes in the fence. The fence will never be the same."

The little boy listened carefully as his father continued to speak.

"When you say things in anger, they leave permanent scars just like these. And no matter how many times you say you're sorry, the wounds will still be there."

There are so many verses in the Bible to encourage us and guide us in taming our reaction and response to the things that hurt or bother us. James 1:19-20 can be summed up in three words for quick recall - "Quick, Slow, Slow." "This you know, my beloved brethren, But everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger; for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God."

As we're learning in Youth Group, life is short. We can't control others or what's happening around us, but we can learn to control ourselves and our response. "Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and give no opportunity to the enemy." As Ian reminded us, we are so lucky to KNOW God. In knowing God, we can rest assured he can help us to allow the old to fall away so the new can come, even the hard stuff.

Theme: "Living God's Love"

Business Meetings began with short Bible Study by various pastors. Moderator McElwee stated that enough time and discussion has been spent on the human sexuality issue and will now be decided by individual congregations. The majority of time was dedicated to wording changes. Topics included reparations to people of color and all indigenous people.

It was emphasized that congregations would disagree but that they should "Disagree in Love."

Several anniversaries were celebrated. 75 years of Brethren Volunteer Service; 100 years of the church in Nigeria under persecution.

Three new Brethren churches were welcomed. Rwanda, Bhrundi and the Congo added <u>80</u> new churches.

The Exhibit Hall was the scene of many ministries including quilting, books, silent auction, coffee house, podcasts, game night and Ice-cream social. Brethren Press provided a wide variety of materials for all age groups.

Women Pastors Breakfast was widely attended displaying the growing acceptance of women in the pulpit.

Expansion of online worship is a reality.

120 pints of blood were donated. \$13,000.00 was raised at the silent auction.

An On Earth Peace march was scheduled from the Convention Center to City Hall.

Youth and adult choirs performed at evening worship services.

Communion was served at Saturday's closing service as was the consecration of 2024 and 2025 moderators.

Next year's theme: "Welcome and Worthy."
