For Unto Us a Child is Born

Isaiah 9:6-7 NLT

⁶ "For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ His government and its peace will never end. He will rule with fairness and justice from the throne of his ancestor David for all eternity. The passionate commitment of the Lord of Heaven's Armies will make this happen!"

I'm sure many of us have heard this scripture passage many times before at Christmas. It is the prophet, Isaiah, from the Old Testament foretelling the coming of the Messiah. This child will be like no other child born before or after. This child is born of humanity, but also is the divine Child of God. The passage foretells of the First and Second Comings of Christ. Correction In Announcement For Vote Count On Pastoral Call

The 81.5 % favorable vote count for our pastoral candidate, Mark Balilis, was not correct. It should have been announced as an 86% favorable count. There were 86 yes votes, 14 no votes and 5 people abstained. The abstention votes should not be counted in the percentage because anyone who has abstained in a matter is saying that they do not want to weigh in on that matter. To count them in the total gives them the same value as a "no" vote and that would not be correct. Our announcement should have read as follows: "there were 86 "yes" votes and 14 "no" for an approval vote of 86%. In addition, there were 5 people who abstained from voting".


