


Souper & Movie Night Saturday, February 3rd At 4:30 p.m. Movie will show at 6:00 p.m.

A WORD FROM PASTOR GRETCHEN,

As a teenager I was blessed to have very dedicated youth leadership. Dale and Lisa Bowers were not only family, but they were also an important young family within our church. After getting married post high school and before having their own children, Dale and Lisa found great joy in volunteering together to love and lead the teens of our church.

Every Sunday for a portion of the year we would get together to study, fellowship, and explore. We spent time reading the bible, enjoying fellowship over a meal, and taking great adventures. We often went to Camp Brethren woods for retreats and volunteered wherever we could make a difference. Youth Group was a special experience for me and deeply contributed to the Christian I am today. It's from firm foundations great buildings and monuments are built. This is the same for building followers of Christ.

When I look back on this time in my life there are so many memories that come flooding forward. One that stands out especially loud is a caving trip we took as a small group one Sunday afternoon. Now this was before you could pay someone a price for caving gear and a tour guide. This was in a time before permission slips and clearance forms. We didn't have any rope or gear to keep us safe.

As we climbed up rocks structures and crawled through narrow passages, we were just anxious and excited to discover whatever was at the top of the pile or end of the tunnel. I remember having to balance across a rock bridge with a drop we couldn't see the bottom of. If any of us slipped or lost our grips, who knows what could have happened.

And it could have happened. It was damp, wet in many places, slippery and cold. It was hard to see and count on the flashlights hanging round our necks. In retrospect, we were feeling our way through the dark, trusting each other, and our leaders to get us through. And we did it all with anxious, excited hearts. Hearts that were focused on opportunity and a chance to grow.

As we approach another new year some folks will find themselves in a dark and damp, cold and maybe even dangerous place. These situations can make us feel hopeless and full of fear we won't find our way out or through. But just like the brave leaders that led my youth group out of the cave that Sunday, God leads us every day.

There is no cave he can't see us through, no situation he can't turn into an opportunity. It's a guarantee, a real promise of promise. As you look at the rocks you may have to climb, the tunnels you may have to crawl through, I hope you find some excitement in the challenge. There is no reason to be afraid of the dark or scared to slip and fall. God, his son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are more gear than you'll ever need.


