The Pastor's Pen...

April 2024



Sometimes following the weather can feel a little like riding a roller coaster. Even though this past winter was a mild one overall, we still struggled with the up and down, unpredictable nature of it all. To borrow a variation on the theme commonly associated with March, winter went out like a lamb (average daily temperature March 1-18 was 50.8° F); while spring came in more like a lion (average daily temperature March 19-24 was 40.7° F). Sounds a bit like life, doesn't it?

While it is true that our human lifetime follows a pattern that loosely compares to the changing seasons of the year, it is also true that there is much that is "up and down" and unpredictable along the way. The new life and colors of spring and summer are often punctuated by days of clouds, rain, and storms. And sometimes, those storms seem to last forever. Similarly, the soft changes of autumn and the harshness of winter ultimately usher in nature's sleep of death. Yet even those seasons are often sprinkled with gifts of sunshine, beauty, and joy.

All of this reminds us that while we have no control of the weather—in nature or in life—we don't have to let the weather control us. We can choose to be miserable and frustrated when the weather is not to our liking, or we can accept each season of life—along with its surprises—trusting in a God who is all-knowing, all-loving, all-powerful, and everywhere present…all the time.

This particular time of year, with the passing of winter to spring, is filled with particular reminders of God's character, especially when we take to heart the truths reflected in what we call the "Christian calendar." As winter begins, we celebrate the time in history when the Word became flesh, when Jesus, the Son of God, became one of us and lived among us. God *knows* all things because God *created* all things. But now, through Christ, God *experienced* human existence—suffering, rejection, temptation—from the inside out. And through his life, Jesus showed us how to face life—and death—with faith, courage, and compassion for others.

In his death, Jesus demonstrated the depth of God's *love*. There is no greater love among men, Jesus said, than one who lays down his life for a friend. But God demonstrated his love *this* way: while we were yet *sinners*, Christ died for us.

Following this expression of divine love, on the third day God demonstrated his *power* over death itself. Death could not keep its prey. Christ arose to life and promises eternal life to all who trust in him. And before leaving this earth, he also promised his presence, and the presence of the Spirit, to be with us always.

May we face every season of the year, and every season of our lives, with faith in the God who knows all, loves us fully, can do all, and is with us always. To God be the glory!

Rockingham Male Chorus – April 21, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. Chambersburg Church of the Brethren

The Rockingham Male Chorus of the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia is a group of volunteer musicians from a variety of backgrounds, careers and denominations who welcome the opportunity to travel and sing the gospel of Christ. "The Singing Men" as they are known, travel hundreds of miles on an annual basis giving 20-30 concerts covering an area from Pennsylvania to Florida. They will be performing at **Chambersburg Church of the Brethren** on Sunday evening, April 21st at 6:00 p.m. in the sanctuary.

Organized in 1966, the founder and original director of the Rockingham Male Chorus was Dr. Nelson T. Huffman, a music professor who taught at Bridgewater College in Bridgewater, Virginia. Dr. Huffman led the "Singing Men" through their 500th concert before retiring in 1987. The Chorus subsequently reorganized and selected David MacMillan to serve as its director.

David MacMillan, a graduate of Shenandoah Conservatory of Music in Winchester, VA continues to serve as the director of the Chorus, and his wife, Kathy, serves as accompanist. Chorus members gather on a weekly basis from September until May for rehearsals. To date, the Chorus has provided over 1400 concerts.

Admission to the Rockingham Male Chorus concert is free however a freewill offering is received to help offset administrative and travel expenses. The public is cordially invited to attend.



Pastors and Nurses. Each serves for a week of camp and room and board are free.


The responsibilities of the nurse are to distribute campers' medication and aid in any first aid that needs to be given out to campers or staff.
