Honoring Fathers and Others

Each year, in our church and our country, late spring is filled with days and events inviting us to express honor. We have honored mothers and teachers. May 27th we will observe a national holiday set aside to honor the men and the women who gave their lives serving and defending our country. June 9th, in our Sunday service, we will honor high school and college graduates within our church family. Then on June 16th, we will join our nation in honoring our fathers.

Writing to the church in Rome, well into the first century, Paul wrote about honor. In Romans 12:10, a section focused on our relationships with each other, he wrote, "Honor one another above yourselves." In Romans 13:7, focused on relationships with the people in the world around us, he wrote, "Give everyone what you owe him: If you owe taxes, pay taxes;... if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor." And then in his letter to the church in Ephesus, in a context about relationships within families, he quoted the sixth commandment, "Honor your father and your mother" (Ephesians 6:2). In each of these cases, the word translated "honor" carries the idea of making a careful and accurate valuation of someone and then expressing their worth through our attitude toward them, and through our words and deeds.

This is where it gets tricky. We often undervalue people. A person's worth is more than what we can see on the outside. It is greater than our experience of that person or the benefit we recognize that they have provided to us. Proper honor of anyone starts with acknowledging that they have worth simply by virtue of being someone who is created by God, loved by God, and who bears the image of God.

Yet, honor goes beyond that. It also carries the idea of worth related to their role in our lives or in the lives of others (parents, teachers, government officials, law enforcement officers), what they have accomplished (graduates), or what they have given to group of people, a nation, or humanity as a whole (soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice in giving up their lives to help keep our country safe).

Fathers specifically impact their children, through participation in giving life, through participation in the provision and nurturing of that life, or both. There are few people in our lives (mothers being one) with the potential to impact us for good as much as fathers.

But just as we acknowledged last month in relation to Mother's Day, things can also get a little complicated on Father's Day. Fathers can also leave deep wounds. Not everyone had a father who was present, let alone a father who saw them, understood them, affirmed them, equipped them, provided for them, loved them, or even liked them. How do we honor a father who in some ways was not honorable?

It is possible to give respect and even honor to our fathers in the midst of a reality that may be far short of the ideal. It is possible to love and to forgive fathers and to seek to be better and to do better for our own children.

Let's also make room in our hearts for those whose fathers are no longer present, for those fathers who have lost children or whose children are separated from them, and for those who have wanted to be fathers but are not.

As we continue through this season, and every season, let's seek to cultivate a culture of recognizing the true worth of those around us, of extending grace and compassion, and of honoring one another well.

The Board Report

June 2024



In April, following the regular business meeting discussion – financials, commission requests, old and new business items, Pastor Mark and Ian Irvin lead the board members through a personal assessment tool called DISC. This tool is used to help improve teamwork, communication, and productivity in any environment where teams work together.

DISC is an acronym that stands for the four main personality profiles described in the DISC model (D)ominance, (I)nfluence, (S)teadiness and (C)onscientiousness.

People with D personalities tend to be competitive, driven and are results oriented.

People with I personalities tend to be persuasive, inspiring and enthusiastic.

People with S personalities tend to be dependable and place an emphasis on cooperation and sincerity.

People with C personalities tend to place an emphasis on quality, accuracy, expertise and competency.

The Board members took a short personality assessment and accumulated their scores to determine their predominate personality type. Many scored high in more than one category. Understanding one another's personality styles will allow Board teams to build stronger, more effective working relationships.

The Board then identified three high priority items to work on and assigned 5 Board members to each team.

In June, teams began working on the following three high priority items:

- Organizational Structure
- Employee Handbook
- Growth of Young Families, Singles and Elementary Aged Programs

Pastor Mark distributed DISC style reports for insight into how to work with various styles. In addition to accomplishing results for the high priority items, members are asked to learn about working as functioning teams, respecting differences, and utilizing everyone's strengths.
