

The Pastor's Gen...



Four weeks ago, the last Sunday in August, our congregation gathered for worship and celebrated four new members to our church family, and one re-affirmation of faith by a long-time member. Four of those individuals chose to be baptized by immersion as a public expression of their faith in Jesus Christ and their membership commitment to our church.


Baptism is one of the most important ordinances within our Brethren heritage, and is practiced in some form by every Christian denomination. An ordinance is defined as a practice in the church that meets two basic criteria. It is practiced in obedience to a direct commandment of Jesus to his disciples. It is an outward physical expression of a deeper spiritual reality.

Baptism signifies the start of (or a new beginning in) our journey as followers of Jesus and in fellowship with each other. Immersion into water signifies cleansing and forgiveness that is available to each of us when we acknowledge our sin and ask God for mercy. Going into the water also represents our identification with Jesus' death and our willingness to die to ourselves as we follow Him. Similarly, coming out of the water represents our identification with Jesus' resurrection and the promise of eternal life through faith in Him.

Second to baptism among Brethren is the ordinance of the Love Feast, which includes Communion. In obedience to Jesus' command, His followers "remember His death" in the eating of bread and the drinking of a cup (juice or "wine"). Communion in some form is practiced by every Christian denomination. Brethren, however, hold that Jesus' commandment to "wash one another's feet" (in the midst of the Passover meal) expands this ordinance to include both a simple meal and the practice of washing each other's feet. As the Bread and Cup represent Jesus' death, the meal represents our fellowship as members of one Body or family. The washing of feet represents both our need of daily cleansing (forgiveness) and Jesus' commandment that we serve one another. In this sense, the ordinance of Love Feast signifies, not the beginning, but the continuation and nurturing of both our individual journeys as followers of Jesus and our journey together as members of the Body of Christ.

On Sunday, October 5th, all are invited to join us as immediately following our 9:30 worship, as we share together in the Brethren Love Feast and symbolically renew our commitment to Jesus Christ and to each other.

When she and her husband, Chip (Glenn), returned to Chambersburg in 1977, Nancy joined the 4th Street Church of the Brethren through a letter of transfer.

As they raised their four children Nancy was active in Circle, Christian Education Commission, taught Sunday School, directed the Children's Choir, assisted with the Youth Program, and directed Vacation Bible School. She is currently facilitating a weekly Bible Study.

At this juncture in her life Nancy feels that she would like to renew her baptism signifying her faith, commitment and dedication to Christ through the Brethren tradition of immersion.



Julie Sarver has been worshiping with us for more than a year. Perhaps you have met her or seen her singing in our chancel choir or playing in the bell choir or singing with the praise band or playing the trumpet or serving in some other way. But her connection with our church family goes back to her school years when she was a music student of Phil Thorpe's. Her journey of faith took some twists and turns in the intervening years. And now, God's grace has guided her back to this place where open arms and open hearts and the message of God's unconditional love have brought healing and hope. She now desires to express publicly her faith and trust in Jesus through Christian baptism."



Larry Paulsgrove has attended Fourth Street Church for approximately 30 years.

He grew up in Hagerstown MD and attended Grace Brethren Church also in Hagerstown with his family.

Over those years he was never baptized, but he has decided that now was the time to take that step in his faith journey.



Sam Robertson was born and raised in Chambersburg. He went to college in Shippensburg and taught school for 33 years at Cumberland Valley High School in Mechanicsburg, moving back to Chambersburg after he retired.

Over the past 2 years, Sam has been putting his life back together. After years of alcohol abuse and with the help of his family and friends, he checked into a recovery program. He is now in a much better place. With the help of many, including many in this church, he has decided to reaffirm his commitment to God and his love for Jesus Christ.

Whether you know it or not, many of you have had a profound impact on his journey back to Christ.

Brenda Hoover has been worshiping here at 4th Street for the past few years. Many of you have never met her, but you might recognize her as the lady in the mask who sits in the back.

Brenda has lived in and around Chambersburg her entire life. She was baptized as an infant and later confirmed in the United Brethren Church. She later moved her membership to the United Methodist Church on 2nd St. Brenda's recent connection to our congregation coincides with her role as a care-giver for her mother, who lives nearby on Liberty Street and is immune compromised. For that reason, Brenda tries to avoid as much contact and exposure in large crowds.

Although her mom is not able to engage directly in her own United Methodist church community, she has taken an interest in her neighbors here at the Church of the Brethren and keeps up with much of what is happening here, often watching through her window the comings and goings. When Brenda arrives there after worship here, they always talk about the service and the announcements in the bulletin.

Brenda had been thinking about joining the church for several months, and when she heard about our plans for this Sunday, she thought maybe this was the time. Only later did the actual date register in her mind as something of a divine confirmation. August 31st is Brenda's birthday.




Special Music Guest - October 26, 2025

The Board Report September 2025

The following is the announcement provided by the Board Chair, Marsha Smith on Sunday, September 14, 2025.

I would like to take a few minutes to keep you abreast of the work of your Church Board.

As you can see from the back of your church bulletin, the financial standing (net income) of the church year to date as of the August 31, 2025 report is at a deficit of over \$50,000. While our expenditures are less than budgeted, which is a positive position, unfortunately, our income is significantly lower than our year today expenses.

A special Board meeting was held on August 26th to review our financials and a needs planning document provided by the Properties Commission. The needs document provided projected capital improvements estimates to replace HVAC units and other facility needs.

The Board approved the following motion:

Take necessary steps to inform the congregation of the financial situation and develop and implement a plan for a capital campaign to meet the immediate financial needs of the church as identified by the properties commission and continue focusing on the long-term financial needs and growth of the congregation.

The Board appointed a subcommittee charged with working on a proposed capital campaign that will be reviewed during the November council meeting.

The Board will have an extended review of 2026 budget requests by commission chairs during the October 14th board meeting. All are welcome to attend this meeting.

The Board will provide more details of the financial status and needs of the church in the Council meeting packets which will be available in church mailboxes on November 2nd. Sunday November 16th is our council meeting.

Suspension of bylaws for the Board, commissions and committees was approved at last year's November's board meeting. All members of the current board that want to service in 2026 will be included in the council meeting ballot. You will be selecting 6 Board members to serve in 2026.

I am asking for your continued support, providing suggestions and feedback and praying for Board wisdom as we move forward. If you are interested in serving on the Board or even if you have ideas concerning our financial state, please feel free to reach out to me or any Board member.



Southern PA District Conference Report – September 19-20, 2025

The Southern PA District Conference was held at Hanover Church of the Brethren. The theme for the conference was *Prayer Changes...Things, Me, You,* with scripture text from Hebrews 4:14-16. This year's moderator was Eric Reamer from Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren.

Friday, September 19, 2025

- After an opening time of praise and hearing God's Word, the business session began with the consecration of delegates. Representing our church were: Ray and Linda Burkholder, Kim Frazer and Carol Wingert.
- Two annual meetings which take place each year at district conference: The Brethren Home Board Meeting, and the Children's Aid Society Board Meeting
- The delegates overwhelmingly approved an organizational restructuring of The Brethren Home Foundation (TBHF) and Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community (CKV-TBHC). As part of this approval, TBHF and CKV-TBHC moved from being an agency of the Southern Pennsylvania District of the Church of the Brethren (SOPA) to a partnership bound by a relationship covenant.
- This decision, informed by thoughtful consideration and sound legal counsel, affords legal protection to SOPA, TBHF, and CKV-TBHC, while also preserving and reaffirming the meaningful relationships that have been established over generations. If you have further questions about this, please contact the SOPA Moderator.
- o The day ended with a Prayer Service/Re-Licensing Service and an ice-cream social.

Saturday, September 20, 2025

- A Bible Study on prayer was led by Fred Keener
- o The ballot was distributed and voted upon for district board members.
- Reports were presented for: COB Denominational, Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center,
 District Board and Commissions, District Executive, District Executive Search Committee,
 Financials for the District, District Auditors, Standing Committee, and Camp Eder.
- Some discussion was centered on the 2026 budget with two amendments being voted down.
 The district is trying very hard to have a balanced budget. The budget was approved as presented.
- DFMA (District Financial Ministries Allocation) was voted on and approved. The DFMA is the amount the district assesses each church per member. The amount per member for one year is \$101.06.

Conference concluded with the recognition of outgoing board members and the consecration of those newly elected to the board. At the close of the session, Moderator Eric Reamer passed the gavel to the 2025 Moderator, Nicholas Wingert.

Since our Moderator is Nicholas Wingert, the Chambersburg Church of the Brethren will be hosting District Conference next year on September 18-19, 2026. Please think about how you would like to help out with this event and contact Nicholas or the church office!
