Struggles, Requests, Thanksgiving

Each month, as I put together my newsletter article, I am mindful of the context in which I am writing. I think about the calendar—where we are in the changing of seasons or upcoming holidays. I think about where we are in our journey as a church family—what we are celebrating and where we are struggling. And I think about what message God might have for us in any or all of those spaces.

According to the calendar, we are fast approaching November. We'll soon be halfway through fall, with winter just around the corner. For some, as the temperature drops, so do our spirits. The days grow shorter and the nights last longer. Thanksgiving will be here before we know it.

Where are we in our journey together? It seems clear that we are not feeling especially thankful. In fact, since the start of September, we have had little celebration and lots of struggle.

We entered the new school year with high hopes for both existing ministries and a new one. So far, we have had two months in a row with lower turnout than usual for our Midweek Meals-to-Go. So far, we've had low turnouts for 4th Street Youth and 4th Street Kids. So far, Smart Cookies Preschool has had strong enrollment, but there have been so many extra challenges for our staff to navigate. So far, our new Contemporary Worship has been meaningful for 20-30 of our church family members each week, but we have seen only a few first-time visitors. We choose hope as we continue to prepare, to show up, and to serve, but we feel the struggle.

We especially feel the struggle in the midst of growing concern over our current financial shortfall and what that means for our future. Church Board members have spent hours trying to discern what steps we might be able to take now in order to find our best way forward together. And on Sunday, November 16, we will gather for our annual Congregational Meeting. We will listen to reports and recommendations and responses. We will call leadership, engage in discernment, and make decisions that will impact 2026 and beyond.

In the midst of it all, I invite us to listen to Paul's words in his letter to the church in the Greek city of Philippi. Read this passage slowly. Then read it again.

⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵ Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard you hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7, NIV)

These are not simplistic words suggesting that we just put on a happy face and everything will be fine. Paul wrote these words while imprisoned. He understood struggles and disappointments and challenges in ministry. His own future—even whether he would live or die—was uncertain.

In the midst of Paul's struggles, and in the midst of ours, he invites us to *rejoice*. He says that twice. He invites us to *be gentle*... in our reactions to our circumstances and in our engagement with each other and everyone we encounter. He invites us to find comfort and strength in the knowledge that *God is near*. He invites us to *let go of anxiety* and, in its place, in *every* situation (including our current ones), to *bring our requests*—our concerns, our struggles, our fears, our hopes—to *God*. And he invites us to include *thanksgiving* as an important part of our perspective and our prayers. If we do all this, he says, *the peace of God will guard our hearts and minds*.

May it be so for each of us as we walk this journey together.

The Church Board met on October 14, 2025. Our agenda for the evening was to review the current financial report, to review the proposed 2026 budgets, and to discuss the current and long-term financial status of the church.

Commission chairs presented their proposed 2026 budgets. Each line item was reviewed, discussed and revised as needed. I wish to thank the commissions for their diligence in the preparation of these budgets.

The Board discussed the financial forecast for the future and options for addressing the current and future financial needs. The Board will meet again on October 28th to continue the discussions.

In addition to the Board meetings, a sub team of the Board is meeting weekly to analyze some viable options including capital campaigns and potential grant funding.

This is a critical time in the life of our church. Your prayers for strength and guidance for the Board members are needed. Please feel free to attend any Board meeting or speak to a Board member to share your thoughts, ideas, or questions.


There will be two opportunities for members to participate in an information and discussion session regarding our current and long-term financial needs.

11/16: Combined Worship: Council Meeting


