

Imagine! Did you ever consider how much power and potential could be contained in a single word?

To imagine is "to form a mental image of something not present" (Merriam-Webster). The applications are practically unlimited. We can imagine a place we have never been. We can imagine a piece of artwork that has not been produced or a song that has not yet been written. We can imagine an experience we have never had. We can imagine what another person might be feeling in a given moment or circumstance. We can imagine new ideas or solutions to problems. We can look at things as they are and imagine them as they could be.

Back in July, at the close of this year's Church of the Brethren Annual Conference, our new Moderator, Don Fitzkee, revealed the theme he had chosen for our 2026 Annual Conference. It was a single word. It was this word. **IMAGINE!** In his Theme Statement on the Annual Conference website, he references the late theologian Walter Brueggemann's conclusion that the role of a *prophet* is to *imagine new possibilities*. Fitzkee then suggests, "Perhaps one reason the church remains mired in the same old patterns is that we have lost our ability to envision anything better."

For this year's Advent Season, we have chosen this same theme, "**IMAGINE!**" In both our traditional and contemporary services, we will be invited to exercise our imaginations as we seek to put ourselves in the places of the real women and men whose lives and stories became part of *God's* story in sending Jesus. We will *imagine* what it might have been like for *them* to imagine **hope**, imagine **peace**, imagine **joy**, and imagine **love**—*before* those gifts were fully revealed in Christ.

We will be invited *also* to identify similar spaces within *our own* lives and circumstances. We will be invited to take what we know about the lives and circumstances of *others* and to imagine how they feel. We will be invited to look at *how things are*, and to imagine *how things could be*. We will be invited to imagine what it might be like to *experience*, or to be part of helping *others* experience, an infusion of **hope**, an infusion of **peace**, an infusion of **joy**, and an infusion of **love** this Christmas season and *beyond*.

Please join us on this journey and invite others along. A little imagination may be *just what we need*, and just what the *world* needs *from us*, at *this* moment in our *journey together* and into the coming year.




